

Why Leadership Edinburg? An Overview

Thirty-Two years ago, a group of Edinburg citizens involved in the Edinburg Chamber of Commerce decided leadership would improve if potential and emerging leaders had an opportunity to interact with one another and learn about the problems and issues facing the community.

From this vision, Leadership Edinburg grew to the program we have today. In August 2021, the Steering Committee will select approximately fifteen to twenty new members for Class XXXIII. Each of these individuals must show past evidence of community involvement and express a desire for future leadership. In return, Leadership Edinburg commits to provide distinct learning environments, which will improve its member's leadership skills and opportunities.

To date over 500 people have met the Leadership Edinburg challenge. After completing the class, members have gone on to improve Edinburg by serving their committees, by serving on community boards and by working in local politics. We invite you to become part of this tradition by applying for membership in Class XXXIII.

<u>Mandatory Kick off Retreat:</u> During the <u>September retreat</u>, class members will participate in various hands-on and physical activities designed to identify various styles of leadership. Class members will analyze their own leadership styles and learn ways to communicate with other types of leaders. The class will then use their skills on several problem-solving activities.

Monthly Class Sessions: The class will meet every third (3rd) Wednesday of the month at 11:30 – a.m. to 5:30 p.m. from October 2021 through May 2022. There are a couple of exceptions for the Education session which will start at 8:00 a.m. and the March session which will meet on the 4th Wednesday. Each session will provide an outlook on the industry from experts in the field and discuss particular community issue (e.g. criminal justice, education, economic development, health care) and learn how it affects the people of Edinburg. Class members will have the opportunity to meet and interact with a wide variety of community leaders. Class members will also have the opportunity to learn from one another by sharing their own unique insights and perspectives through discussion and debate. Please be aware that one session may change to an earlier time.

<u>Class Project:</u> The class will identify a pressing Edinburg Chamber or Community need and design and implement a project to meet that need. Actively participating in the project allows members to strengthen their community network further. The project has to be identified by November session.

<u>Eligibility requirements:</u> The proposed number of participants is limited; therefore, those applicants with demonstrated leadership potential related to the enhancement of Edinburg would receive priority. Eligible applicants not initially selected to participate in the program, will be placed on a waiting list for consideration at a later date. The Selection Committee will review all applications and select a class

which is broadly representative of the community. There are no restrictions regarding race, sex, or religion.

Attendance requirements

- 1. Leadership Edinburg is a nine-month program, September through May, consisting of nine 6-hour meetings on a specific topic, once a month. Meetings are usually held on the 3rd Wednesday of each month, September through May (unless otherwise noted). Attendance at all sessions is required. Those failing to meet attendance requirements will be asked to withdraw. Punctual attendance of meetings is required. Late arrival or early departure from program meetings exceeding a total of two hours will result in automatic dismissal. If an absence is absolutely unavoidable, two days advance notice is required. A formal letter after the 1st absence will be sent to participant. The Leadership Edinburg Committee will address attendance and absenteeism issues and take appropriate action as deemed necessary.
- 2. Telephone use will be restricted to breaks only.
- 3. A Class Welcome social is scheduled **September 09**, **2021** to welcome the class and meet the Leadership Edinburg Steering Committee.
- 4. A <u>mandatory</u> retreat scheduled **September 24 & 25**, **2021** initiates the course and a graduation concludes the ninth month program.
- 5. A firm commitment by the applicant and his or her employer (where applicable) to the Leadership Edinburg Program concept forms the basis for a successful program. Those currently unable to make a firm commitment may wish to apply at a later date.

Tuition

Tuition and private contributions fund the program. Upon acceptance into the program, the participant will be billed for tuition of \$550.00. \$275.00 is due by the Leadership Edinburg Welcome Social (Thursday, September 9th) and the balance is due by the Leadership Edinburg Retreat (September 24 & 25) A \$50.00 late fee will be imposed if tuition payment is made after the deadline. Applicants should make arrangements in advance to meet the tuition deadline. NO REFUNDS.

All applicants will be confidentially evaluated.

Application Deadline - Friday, August 20, 2021

Applications received after Friday, August 20, 2021 will be evaluated for eligibility and future enrollment consideration. Applicants will be notified on the status of their application on or before Friday, August 27, 2021.
